2) Chemical Analysis: Consumer Product Improvement Act of 2008 – Sec. 108 Phthalate Content:

PHTHALATE BAN: - Beginning January 10th, 2009 it shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture for sale, offer for sale, distribute in commerce, or import into the United States any children’s toy or child care article that contains concentrations of more than 0.1 percent of di-(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP), dibutyl phthalate (DBP), or benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP).

INTERIM PROHIBITION: - Beginning January 10th, 2009 and until a final rule is promulgated, it shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture for sale, offer for sale, distribute in commerce, or import into the United States any children’s toy that can be placed in a child’s mouth or child care article that contains concentrations of more than 0.1 percent of diisononyl phthalate (DINP), diisodecyl phthalate (DIDP), or di-n-octyl phthalate (DnOP).

PROCEDURE: Sample extraction by Soxhlet (ASTM D3421); Ultrasonic; or Microwave method
Analysis: Gas Chromatographic-Mass Spectrometric (GC-MS)

REQUIREMENTS:

- DEHP, DBP, or BBP – not to exceed 0.1%
- Interim Prohibition - DINP, DIDP, or DnOP – not to exceed 0.1%
