(8 pt, C1S, 88 Brightness; All Mills of Manufacture)

Dear Mr. Spencer:

Please be advised that [REDACTED] Paper's [REDACTED] brand coated bristol paper complies with European Union Directive 2002/95/EC on the restriction of hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment, or RoHS.

We use no lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls (PBBs) or polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDEs) in the manufacture of our [REDACTED] brand papers, and none of these materials is added to the finished product.

Low levels of the listed heavy metals will be present because trees take them up from forest soils. Specifically, lead, cadmium, mercury, and chromium (total) are each present at less than three parts per million. Therefore, this product complies with the total heavy metal limit of 100 parts per million recommended by CONEG and required by EU Directive 94/62/EC and CEN standard CR13695-1. No PBB or PBDE will be in our 8 pt, C1S, 88 brightness [REDACTED] brand coated bristol paper as shipped or delivered.
