Re: [REDACTED] response to Consumer Product Safety legislation concerning Lead and Phthalates

This letter may be utilized as [REDACTED] certification regarding the presence or absence of Lead and Phthalates in its products.

[REDACTED] sponsors third-party product testing for Heavy Metals pursuant to the standards of CONEG (Congress of North Eastern Governors) and ASTM F963-95 and ASTM F963-96n. The Consumer Product Safety Act of 2008 now requires testing pursuant to ASTM F963-07e1.

The company's testing programs allow it to verify that its products meet applicable standards relating to the presence of Lead. The most recent tests reveal non detectible Lead concentrations, based upon a detection limit of 0.4 parts per million. The company believes that the products tested are representative of its entire product line sold under the [REDACTED] brands. [REDACTED] intends to continue its testing programs.

The company has not conducted third party testing to verify the presence or absence of Phthalates, in its products. However, the company has reviewed MSDS Sheets for all raw materials, and none of these sheets indicates the presence of this substance. The company plans to begin third-party testing for Phthalates in 2009
